# The Missing Moment Checklist

## Reconstructing History: The Missing Moment Checklist

This checklist is your **first step** in reconstructing moments that history forgot — without it looking fake.

### 1. Temporal Anchor

Lock the moment in time.

- **Exact year** (not just the decade)
- **Season** (Spring, Winter, etc.)
- **Time of day** (Early morning? Dusk?)
- **Technology available at that moment** (Do not introduce later technology!)

#### RealityBreak:

If your image could belong to multiple decades, it's already wrong.

### 2. Environmental Constraints

Remove what shouldn't exist yet.

- **Building materials** of the era (Was it wood, brick, stone?)
- **Street layouts** (Check width, paths, etc.)
- **Grime, smoke, or wear** (History wasn't clean)
- **Infrastructure limitations** (Lighting, roads, etc.)

#### RealityBreak:

AI often defaults to modern cleanliness. History was messier.

# The Missing Moment Checklist

## 3. Human Reality Check

How people actually looked, stood, and behaved.

- **Posture** appropriate for the period
- **Clothing wear** (Creases, dirt, and rips)
- **Grooming norms** of the time
- **Body language** (Modern stances can easily show up)

**RealityBreak:**

If everyone looks confident or "camera aware," it's out of place in time.

## 4. Optical Authenticity

How would the image realistically have been captured?

- **Camera limitations** (Lens distortion, depth of field, etc.)
- **Motion blur** (Does it fit the era?)
- **Framing** (Perfect composition = fake)
- **Exposure levels** (Too much brightness or contrast?)

**RealityBreak:**

Perfect framing or bright lighting is often a dead giveaway.

# The Missing Moment Checklist

## 5. Bias & Absence Map

What's missing — and why?

- Who wouldn't have been photographed?
- Who controls the narrative of this moment? (Look at power structures)
- What social groups are absent? (No elites? No minorities?)
- What perspectives are unlikely? (Was this moment public or secret?)

RealityBreak:

Absence is just as important as inclusion. History had gaps.

## 6. Plausibility Stress Test

Could this image survive scrutiny?

- Would a historian immediately question anything?
- Does any detail feel "too modern"?
- Is anything unnaturally tidy, stylish, or iconic?
- Does this image feel "observed," not staged?

RealityBreak:

If you need to explain it, it's probably wrong.
